There are so many different ways that you can raise money for UNICEF and we want to help make your fundraising as successful as possible so you can reach and even exceed your £1,500 fundraising target! To help you get off to the best start we've put together some tips and ideas. Our team of experienced fundraisers are also on hand to offer fundraising advice, information about the work for children you are raising money for, and materials including collection boxes, banners, posters and balloons.

#### **Quiz time**

Whether you are a general knowledge mastermind or have a memory like a sieve, everyone enjoys a quiz. Invite friends and family to take part and charge a fee per person or per team. Looking for venues that will let you use their premises for free like your office or a local café or pub will help reduce costs. Why not include a UNICEF round to remind people why you're fundraising?

#### **Chance to win**

Organising a raffle is a great way of generating funds with minimal cost. You can do it as part of a pre-existing event or just hold one as a fundraiser in its own right. When it comes to prizes, don't buy them! Instead use your networks or ask local businesses for donations such as a meal for two in a local restaurant, a personal training session or cinema tickets. Charge a reasonable price for tickets and make sure you let people know all the fabulous prizes you have on offer to generate interest.

## **Foodie fundraising**

Fundraising focused around food never fails to be a success. If you're a whizz in the kitchen why not organise a dinner party and charge people to attend and enjoy your culinary delights? You could even

theme it around the challenge or feature a course from Italy. Hold a baking competition among friends or in the office, charging an entrance fee and selling the treats afterwards, or why not arrange a good old fashioned cake sale.

# **Change for good**

Hold a 'Change for Good' day in your office. Ask everyone to empty out their loose change to donate to your fundraising on a set day or at an event. Or set up a permanent collection box in the office – it will soon add up! For collection buckets and tins, or any other fundraising materials please contact Anais Hawkins.

#### **Dressing up or dressing down**

Make your work day a little bit more interesting by having a fancy dress day. Have a simple dress down day, or go all out and introduce a theme. It can be anything you like – let you imagination run wild! Charge everyone £1 to take a part and a penalty of £2 if they don't.

# **Movie night**

Everybody loves a good movie so why not organise your very own movie night? Hold the screening in a meeting room and charge £10 to attend, which includes a free bag of popcorn. You could even contact your local independent cinema to see it they would consider hosting it. The film could be themed around children or Italy or just a classic movie that you know will be a hit.



# HOW DONATIONS CAN HELP CHILDREN WHENEVER AND WHEREVER CONFLICT OR DISASTERS STRIKE

£5 can help protect 34 children from polio

£50 can provide clean drinking water to 1,500 children for a month

**£155** can enough school supplies to help at least **40** children continue their education in times of emergency and conflict

£500 can buy medical health checks for up to 200 Syrian children

£1,165 can buy a large versatile tent that can be used for a temporary school or health centre, like the one picture below.
